#### ORDINANCE NO. - ORD 2024-05

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, VIRGINIA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2023 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2024, APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES FOR SUCH FISCAL YEAR; ESTABLISHING A TAX RATE ON TAXABLE PERSONAL PROPERTY, REAL ESTATE, AND PROPERTY OF PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATIONS; AND CONTINUING IN EFFECT ALL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, VIRGINIA, RELATING TO TAXES, LICENSES, FEES, SERVICE CHARGES, COSTS AND OTHER CHARGES AND ALL ORDINANCES RELATING TO THE TIME OF PAYMENT THEREOF AND COLLECTION THEREOF, EXCEPT AS HEREIN SPECIFICALLY MODIFIED

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Lexington, Virginia, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The following budget annexed and incorporated by reference, totaling \$52,416,650 for the City of Lexington, Virginia for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024 is hereby proposed, approved and adopted:

#### (SEE ATTACHED BUDGET, incorporated by reference)

**SECTION 2.** Public revenues of the City of Lexington, Virginia are hereby appropriated for public purposes for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, as set forth in the appropriate Section of such budget.

**SECTION 3.** The tax rate for all real estate, including real estate owned by public service corporations, subject to tax for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, shall be and is fixed at \$0.92 per \$100.00 of assessed value of such property per year, with assessed values being established through reassessments pursuant to Section 58.1-3253 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

**SECTION 4.** Personal property tax rates shall be \$4.25 per \$100 valuation from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. Tax relief shall be provided in accordance with Section 366-3D of the City Code. The Personal Property Tax Relief Act (PPTRA) shall be calculated at 44% of the first \$20,000 in value of each such qualifying vehicle in order to use all available state PPTRA relief for January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

**SECTION 5.** Fees, licenses, and service charges are established in accordance with the Schedule of Fees and Charges in the attached schedule and are incorporated by reference.

SECTION 6. The bank stock tax shall be the maximum allowed by law.

**SECTION 7.** The annual salary for each member of the Council of the City of Lexington, Virginia, is hereby established as follows and shall remain in effect until formal action is taken to amend this ordinance:

#### **SECTION 8.**

- 8.1 The City Manager is hereby authorized to transfer funds from one line item to another line item within each Fund of such budget, with the exception of the general contingency account.
- Authorization is hereby given to the City Manager to withhold or postpone the expenditure of any funds appropriated by and in this ordinance when it appears to the City Manager that it would be in the best interests of the City for such expenditure to be withheld; but, this provision shall not in any way limit or restrict the right of the Council of the City of Lexington, Virginia, in its sole discretion to the fullest extent permitted by law, to direct immediate disbursement of any appropriated funds when the Council of the City of Lexington, Virginia, is of the opinion that the funds should be expended regardless of the position or action or inaction of the City Manager.

**SECTION 9.** Any ordinance in conflict with this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent and only to the extent that such conflict exists. However, all ordinances not in conflict with this ordinance shall continue in effect, including specifically all ordinances of the City of Lexington, Virginia, relating to taxes, licenses, fees, service charges, costs and payment and collection thereof continuing in effect except as herein specifically modified.

**SECTION 10.** If any part of this ordinance is found to be invalid by competent authority, the remaining portions of this ordinance shall continue in effect to the fullest extent permitted by law.
